When Intelligence, Investigative Skill and Logic Sink you into Jahannam: Ibn al-Walīd al-Muʿtazilī



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Moreover I have never claimed to be a theologian per se. Ibn al-Walīd (478H), a leader of the Muʿtazilah, learned his doctrine from Abū al-Ḥusayn al-Baṣrī, one of the main figureheads of the Muʿtazilī school. Of what benefit are Muḥammad Hijāb's debate skills and performance artistry for the tube and social media going to be on Yawm al-Qiyāmah when he is unable to distinguish between the Tawhīd of the Messengers and the Tawhīd of the Jahmite Philosophers. When he affirms Islām for Julie the Physicist because she affirmed that her fundamental particle, the muon, has a "necessary existence"—exceeding the misguidance of al-Jahm bin Ṣafwān in this matter. Please note: Ibn al-Walīd was a much more honorable and dignified man— despite his innovation and misguidance—as he is mentioned with wara' and zuhd— than this fake pretentious, character known as Ḥijāb.
